# 1. Welcome from the Chair, round table introductions and Apologies

## Minutes

The minutes from the previous meeting were approved and accepted as a correct record.

# 2. Operational overview by Tim Price, Veolia

Tim Price gave an overview of operational activities at the facility, including an update on the paper pulping facility; he explained the benefits and innovation behind this.

Tim also talked about recruitment at the RERF after it was raised by IK that there was a perception Veolia Leeds employ a lot of agency staff, Tim explained that agency staff who are local often migrate over and become permanent employees. TP said since joining the Leeds team, turnover at the plant had been higher than he liked and that management are in discussions with staff over a new salary and benefits package.

# 3. Residents - Feedback from the community

Resident JO asked if schools were now visiting the facility. SD responded that school visits to the RERF were increasing and more work was being done to encourage schools to visit on educational tours, this included universities and colleges.

# 4. Community Engagement and Community Fund

PT said the Community Benefit Fund was now up and running and those in the Burmantofts and Richmond Hill and Temple Newsam wards (Halton Moor only) can apply.

Resident JN asked about air quality data and whether this could be included in the next community newsletter, TP explained that data from the area would not be sourced from Veolia and would be from an outside body. SD explained that current monthly RERF emissions data is available on the Veolia Leeds website. It was agreed that a general explanation of RERF emissions could be included in the next newsletter to inform people of the limits and guidelines Veolia adhere to.
