

# Perry Barr HRC closed for redevelopment from 31 July 2021

Veolia is working in partnership with Birmingham City Council to redevelop the Perry Barr Household Recycling Centre (HRC) and Waste Transfer Station. The new site will have improved facilities available to the public that will enhance the user experience, increase recycling, and continue the processing of waste and recycling with minimal disruption to the environment and area.



The redevelopment is planned to be completed by Spring 2023.

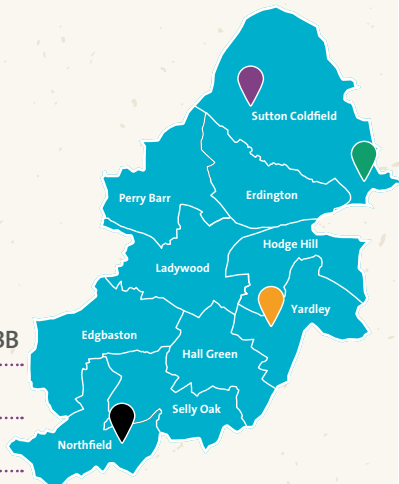

# Your Questions Answered

**Question:** Will the other Household Recycling Centres be able to cope with the extra capacity?

**Answer:** We have monitored the number of visits to the Perry Barr HRC and have identified that the Castle Bromwich HRC will have the capacity to accept the additional visitors during the redevelopment period at Perry Barr.

**Question:** How will the redevelopment benefit Birmingham residents?

**Answer:** The new site will help residents recycle more of the right things in the right way and offer an enhanced user experience. There will be improved parking facilities as well as operational efficiency to reduce the time spent on site.

**Question:** How will the redevelopment impact on the local area?

**Answer:** The redevelopment will improve the local area, the new site will be on one level improving accessibility around the site. All waste streams will be undercover on the transfer station reducing visual impact on the surrounding area. Improved access in and out of the HRC and the new transfer station will reduce the impact on the traffic on Holford Drive.

**Question:** Will vans have access to using the redeveloped Household Recycling Centre site?

**Answer:** The process that currently applies will be continued in the new development - the site will have a height barrier in place to restrict certain vehicles entering the site.
