Did you know...

it only takes **25 of your recycled plastic bottles** to create a new fleece jacket.

Making a plastic bottle from virgin materials uses **75% more energy** than recycling plastics that have been used before.



...it's simple





All you have to do is:

make sure that your recyclables are empty, clean and dry, with the labels removed if possible.

Then we do the rest, here's how it works.

Place your plastic bottles, and other materials that can be recycled, into **your recycling container.**

It will be picked up from the kerbside by your local council **collection team.**

They'll take it to a **Materials Recovery Facility** where all the different materials will be separated.

What happens to your plastic bottles when you put them in your recycling container?





The plastics will be kept together and sent to a **reprocessing plant**.

The reprocessing plant will turn the recycled materials into **raw products** that can be used instead of virgin materials.

Mixed glass

We can recycle mixed glass bottles and jars. Please rinse your bottles and jars and remove the tops.



Paper and cardboard

Paper, newspaper, card and cardboard can all be recycled. Please flatten large boxes and cut them into smaller pieces if you can.



Tins and cans

We can recycle all your tins and cans. Don't forget to remove the labels if you can.



Anything else?

Ask your local council or check out their website to find out what other materials you can recycle and how they should be presented.



Last resort

Any items that can't be recycled should go into your non-recycling bin.
