4	Minutes of last meeting and matters arising	
	Previous minutes sent out 7 th August 2013. Confirmed as a true and correct record.	
	Attendees requested that the minutes be sent out earlier in future.	
	Matters arising: Chimney design external damper – after design assessment the external damper has now been accommodated inside the chimney – stack diameter has been changed to 1.9m with 2.7m diameter connecting flange.	
	Landscaping – March site planting and July weed spraying completed.	
	DH raised concerns relating to the failure of standard trees planted by Veolia contractor. DH considered 70% had failed.	
	GF confirmed such tree planting is subject to 5 years of aftercare and Shropshire Council is looking to formally review in consultation with advisers. If there is a need for replacements, this will be actioned. Not ideal climate this year – there is a mechanism within the planning for failures to be replaced.	
	DH - 1 year has been lost that cannot be recovered.	
	Miles Nichol (MN) – The Contractor that planted the area has come back with less failures than those levels of loss described by DH – Veolia will look at what has happened, speak to Contractor and inform planners about what we can do to maximise chances of growth. MN confirmed that the replacement trees in question are scheduled to be planted in November	Veolia Action

	Veolia Construction Progress Report provided by BS	
	Aerial pictures and work schedule discussed.	
	Tower Crane will be dismantled approximately 7th October.	
6	Project Update	
	Boiler enhancement discussed. JC confirmed that since contract bid submitted over 6 years ago technology has developed, Veolia has therefore procured a higher specification of boiler. This will generate more energy than first forecast.	
	LW – There have been on-going discussions with Veolia regarding boiler enhancement, which culminated in a report to cabinet on the 26th June. This was a closed door meeting which excluded press and public due to commercial confidentiality of certain items.	

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	GF – no issue in planning condition, which allows 95,000t. Original planning application circa 90,000t. The need for a degree of flexibility was identified due to calorific content of some waste; there is no change to grate/size/capacity.	
	PL confirmed there are performance guarantees to ensure that the Council cannot be worse off, as a result of this improvement.	
	LW – from an environmental perspective the modification is an improvement.	
	VB - constituents have concerns regarding increase in traffic movements.	
	LW explained could mean 1 or 2 extra trips per week.	
	PL – existing facility currently accepts significant numbers of vehicles including waste vehicles and EWF development does not cause as much of an increase in traffic movements that people might suspect. Boiler enhancement increase does not have a significant impact on the number of vehicle movements. A Section 106 routing agreement is in place to only use Battlefield link road, with no movements in Harlescott apart from vehicles collecting waste from households. The new facility will have separate entrances for large waste collection vehicles and members of public visiting the Household Recycling Centre.	
	PL – Confirmed expect 60-70,000 tonnes of Shropshire Council residual waste to be delivered	
	DH – will the shortfall be made up of trade waste?	
	PL – A facility is required for Shropshire Commercial waste – otherwise it will have to be transported significant distances which will have a potential impact on commercial waste costs in Shropshire.	
	VB – waste traffic movements to site need to be monitored.	
	PL – the majority of vehicles coming in will be managed by Veolia and the company has internal procedures to deal with any drivers not complying with the Section 106 agreement requiring the use of Battlefield Link Road.	
	JC – Peter Bettis – project questions. We are not intending to go through this now – answers provided to all attendees to read and can pick up at next meeting.

	HH confirmed next communication update for local resident leaflet under process. This will cover items discussed at tonight's meeting and the meet the buyer event held at Shrewsbury Town Football Club.	

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	HH has meetings with Clugston on regular basis. Clugston will be making donations to local charities linked to no Lost Time Injuries (LTI's) on site. Each time 100,000 LTI free hours reached a donation will be made, £500 from Clugston and £500 from Veolia - local charities suggested:
