The facility is in the final stages of commissioning. The ERF has been accepting waste, that would have otherwise gone to landfill, since December and has been exporting electricity, that has been sent to the National Grid, since March.

Work has now begun on the extension to the Household Recycling Centre which when complete will make visiting the site a lot easier for residents. Work on the extension is due for completion in summer 2015.
