Essex residents could be throwing away their chance of love

Littering is a turn-off to 85% of residents in the East of England

Research has revealed that residents from Southend who show love to the environment stand a better chance of finding love! Veolia contracted YouGov to ask a sample of residents across the UK how behaviours such as littering and not recycling would impact their desire to see somebody again after a first date. And the findings show that positive attitudes towards the environment really make a difference when looking for love.

So here's a few facts for those of us in the East of England:

- **85%** are less likely to pursue a love interest with someone who littered during a first date
- **56%** are less likely to see someone after a first date if they purposely put something non-recyclable in a recycling bin
- **60%** are more likely to see someone again if they picked up litter that wasn't their own
